How to tell if an ink cartridge is compatible with your it's frustrating to buy the wrong type of ink cartridge for your printer, especially when you buy it online. When you return the ink and wait for the exchange, you are left with a useless printer. To help you avoid this situation, here are some ways to make sure that a cartridge is compatible before buying it: the first thing you should know is what printer model you have. It is usually displayed on the printer's front control panel. If you can't find it there, it can be on top of the printer, near the cartridge access area or inside the door using cartridges or ink. Once you have your model number, consult the help section on the printer manufacturer's website. Major brands like HP, Canon and Epson offer an extensive list of all their printers, and you should be able to find your model fairly quickly. So, even if you have a lot of ink, you'll still want to change your cartridges at least every year or twice. Is toner cheaper than an ink cartridge? When you're choosing between an inkjet and laser printer, part of your calculations should include how much it will cost in the long run. Laser printers use toner cartridges and use inkjet ink cartridges, and which one you need can affect costs dramatically. A toner cartridge will typically be more expensive than a similarly sized ink cartridge, Westover told us. He further explained that the amount of page ratio is very different, so you get far more pages than toner directly than ink. He also emphasised the difference between laser jet and inkjet printer. If you're using toner, you're using a laser printer, which means it will be better suited for different uses, mainly text and graphics, rather than photo printing, Westover said. Basically, it's all about what you want to do with your printer and how it calculates in your purchase decision. How many pages can be printed with an ink cartridge? It may be better to think of this question in terms of cost per page. This gives you a more accurate picture of the ongoing costs of your printer. The number of pages you can print with the same ink cartridge will vary depending on several factors, most of which will have to do with the types of documents you are printing, ink usage of your specific model, the type and brand you use, as well as your personal settings. As you shop for discount ink cartridges, you will come across the word OEM cartridges. OEM stands for original equipment manufacturer. This may seem vague, so we asked Westover to put it in simple terms. An OEM ink cartridge is the one made by the manufacturer of the printer. So, if it's an HP printer, it's going to be HP ink. Brother, Canon, Epson or whatever the same thing with other brands you use, Westover said the option for OEM means third party [cartridges], which is just made by someone else. Most discount ink cartridge stores sell both OEM cartridges and third-party cartridges. Do printers use refillable ink cartridges? Some printer manufacturers create models that use refillable ink tanks instead of replaceable cartridges. For example, Canon makes pixma series and Epson has several models that use refillable tanks. These might be better for some, as tanks can save money on replacing refilling cartridges, and some people may find it easier to refill a tank by changing a cartridge. However, it should be noted that there is a difference between the printer that uses a refillable tank and the cartridges that you use, you can refill yourself. Third-party companies like InCoval manufacture refillable cartridges for major printer brands. Since refillable cartridges are usually off-brand, you need to make sure they are compatible and won't harm your printer. Printer manufacturers usually advise against using refillable cartridges and say you should opt to buy standards from them instead. How long does the open ink last? Every OEM ink cartridge comes with a factory expiry date, which we recommend you to follow. This is because printer ink dries out over time, even if you do not open or install cartridges. The expiration date is the only indicator you have that the ink has degraded at this point that it's not wet enough to use in your printer. Dry ink can damage the components of your printer and reduce the quality of your printed pages. To avoid wasting full cartridges, buy them as needed. You should store your ink properly so that you don't damage the cartridge. For example, always keep the ink straight. If you store ink cartridges on their backs or edges, you settle the risk of ink in a situation that may ultimately affect your printer's performance and print quality. Can you use expired ink? Buying a lot of ink cartridges at once can cost you money, especially if you don't use your printer heavily. To get the most of each ink cartridge, clean your printhead and align it properly. In addition to proper cleaning and alignment, there are some placement and usage tips to maximize the output and life of ink cartridges. The easiest way to avoid head alignment and cleaning printhead clogs is to print test sheets at least once a week. Regular use ensures that the nozzles remain moist and free from clogs associated with dried bits of ink. If the printer has been idle for several weeks, it is time for cleaning. Most inkjet printers have a maintenance or utility menu in the software interface or hardware menu. Once you find the maintenance menu, look for a tab that says head cleaning or nozzle checks. Printer maintenance professionals suggest cleaning the head once or twice per year based on the regular usage program or when you see a drop in print performance. It is also a good idea to run manual head alignment after the cleaning process is completed to ensure that the nozzles are pointed in the right direction. Any electronic device with printer placement and moving parts sometimes needs to dust off to avoid debris buildup, which in the printer, can cause jams and ink stripes.
